**Minutes**

**I. Welcoming Remarks from Chairman David Brause**

David Brause, BID Board Chairman, welcomed attendees to the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the Long Island City BID, and thanked WeWork for hosting the event. He also recognized some key guests, including NYC Council Member Jimmy Van Bramer, Aliya Latif representing NYC Comptroller Scott Stringer, David Aglialoro representing NY State Assemblywoman Catherine Nolan, and Kisha Johnson representing NY State Senator Michael Gianaris. Mr. Brause added that after the meeting, everyone was welcome to enjoy for food and drinks at the reception.

**II. Certification of Quorum & Approval of Minutes**

Gretchen Werwaiss, Secretary of the Board, certified that a quorum was present. Mr. Brause then presented the minutes from the last BID Annual Meeting on October 11, 2017. Upon a motion duly made and seconded, the minutes were unanimously approved.

**III. Treasurer's Report**

Alan Suna, Treasurer, presented the Year End financial report from July 2017 to July 2018, included in the packets, and stated that we ended the fiscal year with a positive net balance of \$51,546. This was money we put aside in the budget for winter lighting, but we did not spend it because we found out that many of the poles were not yet wired. He noted that that wiring has now taken place over the summer, and we will be able to install winter lights this year. He also reported that we had increased administrative expenses because the Partnership was required to move its office from the 9<sup>th</sup> floor of the building to the basement, and there were related construction and moving costs that were originally not budgeted for.

Mr. Suna also presented the financial statement for August FY20 and reported that all items have met or are better than our target. He noted that the approved FY20 budget includes additional assessment revenue, and reported that the Board approved applying for an increase in the assessment cap to cover the increased cost of our sub-contractors due to the increases in the minimum wage.

**IV. Elections**

Dr. Angelo Ippolito, Acting Nominating Committee Chair, led the election of the Board of Directors. Dr. Ippolito explained that Directors proposed for election (and re-election) at the meeting would be voted on by members of their respective classes and subdistrict (Class A - property owner, Class B – commercial tenant, Class C – residential tenant, and Class D – public; North Subdistrict and South Subdistrict). Upon a motion duly made and seconded, the members voted by class and subdistrict to accept the Proposed Slate of Directors.

**V. Executive Director's Report**

Elizabeth Lusskin, Executive Director, presented the Executive Director's report. She thanked all BID Board members and BID businesses for their support, and gave a special thank you to Council Member Jimmy Van Bramer for all his support. Ms. Lusskin spoke about the great success we had with our LIC Springs! event, and announced that Small Business Saturday would be coming up soon as a great way for residents and visitors to support local businesses and to get involved with the community. She also reported that the BID would be lighting up all the poles throughout the district with holiday lights for the winter season.

Thanks to JetBlue, we planted the tree pits along Queens Plaza South, and we hope to expand the tree pit plantings to all the streets in the BID by organizing 3 volunteer tulip planting days, dates to be announced. Ms. Lusskin reported that we have also kicked off our community arts project, LIC Arts Connection, in which we partner with local and artists to install murals and fence art around the greater LIC area. She also announced that the Sunnyside Yard Steering Committee will hold its first public meeting on October 24<sup>th</sup>, and urged all to come and weigh in on the project. Ms. Lusskin also added that the LICP Gala was taking place on November 14<sup>th</sup>. She thanked the LIC Partnership staff for all their hard work.

**VI. Awards**

Mr. Brause presented the Community Impact Award to Eric Benaim from Modern Spaces and thanked Mr. Benaim for being a longstanding member of the community, a great business leader, and congratulated him on Modern Spaces' 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. This award honored Mr. Benaim's hard work over the last decade and his contributions to the LIC community.

Mr. Brause presented the New BID Business Award to Chris Doeblin from Book Culture LIC and thanked Book Culture for bringing a breath of fresh air to Jackson Avenue and the surrounding community. The store brings a cozy feel to our neighborhood, and offers a wide array of books, cards, and quirky items that truly makes it one of a kind and a meaningful addition to LIC.

Ms. Lusskin then presented the District Stewardship Award to NYC Department of Sanitation Districts 1 and 2, which was accepted by Executive Officer Michael Freitag. Ms. Lusskin thanked the Department of Sanitation for all their hard work in keeping Queens clean, and pointed out how fortunate we are that LIC has daily city trash removal services.

**VII. Adjourn**

Ms. Lusskin thanked everyone for attending, and invited all to enjoy some food and drinks, provided by LIC BID businesses Waheyo and SquareWine and Spirits. With there being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:30 PM.
